# Student Placement/Grouping Process

**Parents often wonder what procedure is used to group students into classes for the next school year.** At each elementary school a grouping committee assists the principals with this process. This committee consists of classroom teachers, special educators, and support staff. Students will be grouped in each class taking into consideration the mix of boys and girls and the mixture of academic abilities. We begin the grouping process in May, but as students register throughout the Spring and Summer, the process will not be complete until mid August. Once the class assignments are complete, a letter will be mailed to parents indicating their child's room number and teacher.

Teachers have been asked **not** to discuss placement with parents. Teachers cannot guarantee the placement of any student.

While requests for a specific teacher **will not** be honored, you may wish to share concerns about your child's particular educational needs. **You may address these concerns in writing to Mrs. Wheeler by June 1, 2010.** Please be concise and limit your comments to the following:

- your child's specific learning style, strengths, or weaknesses;
- a request that your child not be placed with a teacher that an older sibling had;
- critical information that you want your child's teacher to have access to.

If you have a concern, please do not wait until you receive your placement letter in the mail. We may not be able to make changes that late in the process.

# Outdoor Adventure Experience: Hiking Bald Mountain

Date: Saturday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

8:00am - 4:00pm

Third graders at Cicero Elementary School will have the opportunity to participate in an exciting outdoor Physical Education excursion at Bald Mountain on Saturday, June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2010. Bald Mountain is located 4 miles northeast of Old Forge, NY, on Rt. 28. The one (1) mile trail to the summit is labeled moderate in difficulty. However, there are two sections of the trail that may prove to be somewhat difficult for adults who are out of shape.

Students, with a parent or guardian, will hike to the summit of the mountain, have a bagged lunch, and have an opportunity to go up into the fire tower located at the top. On a clear day, the view from the mountain is spectacular. Bring your cameras and binoculars! Since 1994, 1000+ third graders and parents have participated in this trip, and all have had a wonderful outdoor experience.

All students who participate in this excursion will have to be accompanied by a parent or guardian. (Guardian must be 18 years of age or older.) We will be traveling by school bus, and the trip takes two hours. There is no fee for this trip, and parents are not allowed to drive up separately in their own vehicles. (Sorry, brothers and sisters are not allowed to come.) All students and parents must take the bus to and from the mountain. We stop in Old Forge for a bathroom break before we proceed to the mountain.

This trip may be postponed due to inclement weather. In the event of rain, Mr. Stimson and Mr. Bigford will call all participants, and the trip will be rescheduled for the following day, June 6<sup>th</sup>.

Special notice: Because we are limited in the number of parents/students allowed, GET YOUR PERMISSION SLIPS IN EARLY. Do not delay!!

Return all permission slips to Mr. Stimson. I will send home a confirmation during the first week of June, complete with items to bring and the itinerary for the day.

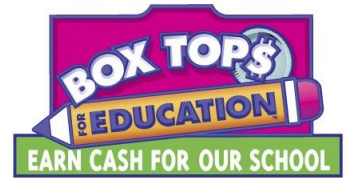

Please keep collecting your box tops and bring them into school through out the remainder of the school year. Then continue collecting them over the summer. Don't forget... next year will be an all new contest.

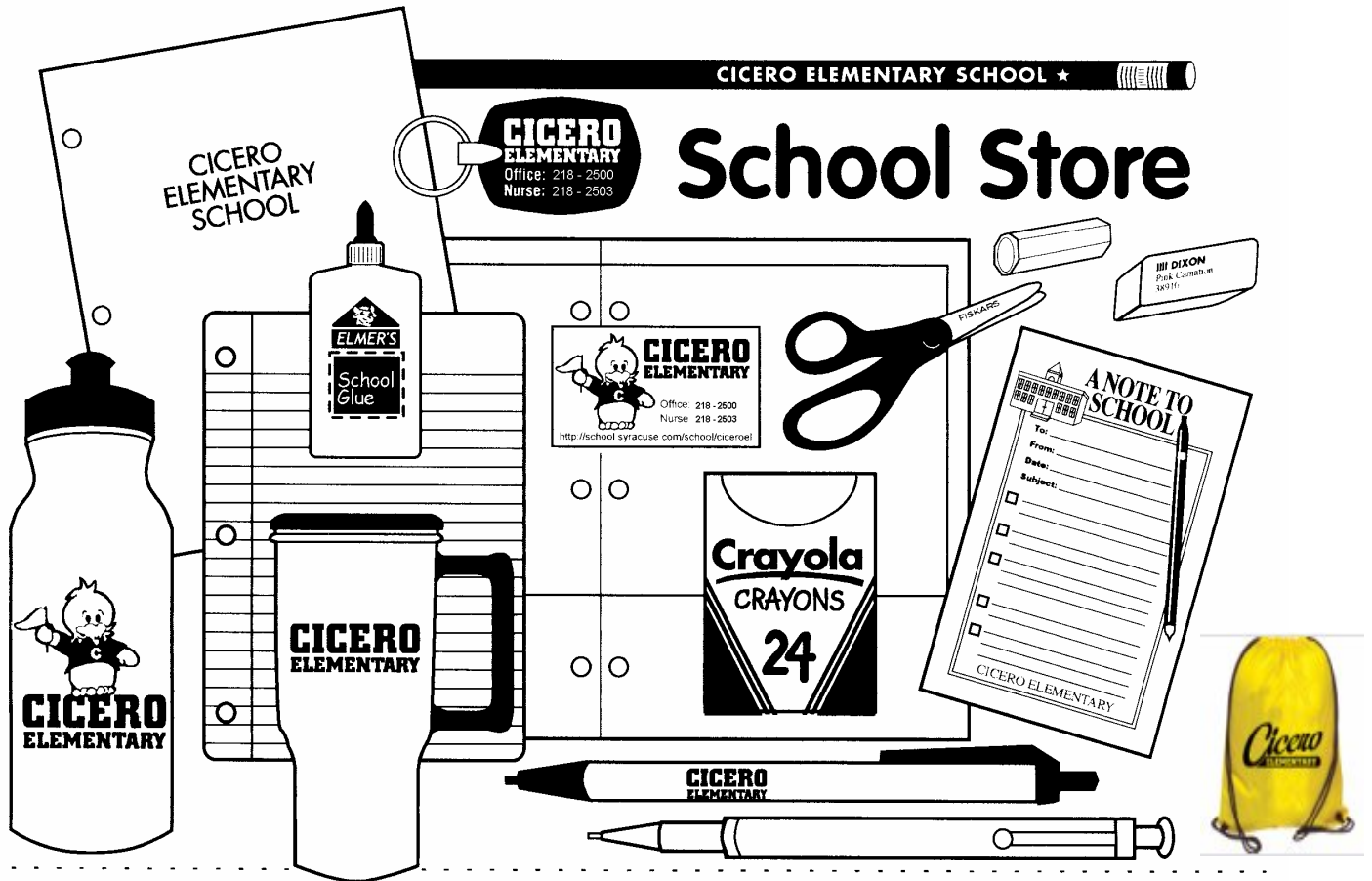
## Congrats to 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade 2010 pizza contest winners!


